The mission of **Connection First, Inc.,** Healing Trauma. Building Hope, a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization (www.connectionfirst.org), is to create spaces where young people are seen, heard, and valued. To this end, the organization will use nonviolent communication and restorative practices to counter the effects of epidemic trauma in all systems: government, education, business, industry, and homes to reduce crime, transform justice and increase connections in our communities.

Annually, over 800 young adults are arrested in Leon County alone. The recidivism rate for juveniles after incarceration is 70–80%. The potential recidivism rate when juveniles are actively involved with **Connection First**, **Inc.** is predicted to be 12%. Committed partners with **Connection First** are State Attorney Jack Campbell, Tallahassee Police Department Chief Lawrence Revell, and Leon County Sheriff Walt McNeil.

The organization is presently fund-raising to support the introduction of the **Connection First** practices into the Leon County School System.
